Fenland District Council Somers Road, Wisbech (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Fenland District Council in exercise of their powers under section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1986 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of Cambridgeshire County Council in accordance with section 39(3) of the 1984 Act, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, intend to make an Order, in respect of the Somers Road Car Park, the effect of which will be to control (inter alia) the use of the car park as a parking place, the position in which vehicles may wait, the class of vehicle and the days and times of operation as set out in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the draft Order together with accompanying plan, and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the Wisbech Area Office, Church Terrace, Wisbech, Cambridgeshire, during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to object to the Order should state their grounds of objections in writing to the undersigned not later than 9th December 1992.

Stopping up of Highways

The highway formerly known as Manchester Road, Cheadle (hereinafter referred to as "old" Manchester Road)—from its junction with the current Manchester Road to its junctions with the M63 motorway embankment and Footpath 3 Cheadle and Gatley (a distance of 211 metres).

SCHEDULE II

Footpath to be Reserved

A footpath 1.8 metres wide running from the junction of Footpath 3 Cheadle and Gatley with "old" Manchester Road eastwards for a distance of 11 metres and then running south-south-eastwards along the eastern edge of "old" Manchester Road for a distance of 120 metres.
