CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

To Hans A. Esseling, c/o Sears Blok, 18 Camberwell Church Street, Camberwell Green, London SE5 8QU.

Pursuant to section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 3 thereto, HM Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give notice that, by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts, certain goods namely:

Semi rigid inflatable speedboat registration No. YR-31-29

have been seized as liable to forfeiture by force of the following provisions namely:

1. Section 141(1)(a) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979

The said speedboat was on 30th December 1991 used for the carriage of Class B controlled drugs, namely 72.28 kilograms of amphetamine sulphate and 190 kilograms of cannabis resin, which were liable to forfeiture.

2. Section 139(1) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979

If you claim that the said goods are not liable for forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in writing in accordance with paragraphs 3 and 4 of Schedule 3 to the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979.

If you are outside the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man you must also give the name and address of a Solicitor in the United Kingdom who is authorised to accept service of process and act on your behalf.

If you do not give notice of claim within the said period of one month or, if any requirement of the above-mentioned paragraph 4 is not complied with, the goods in question will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited.

If you do give notice of claim in proper form, the Commissioners will take legal proceedings for the condemnation of the said goods.
