*North Yorkshire County Council (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) (Various Roads, Brotherton) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that North Yorkshire County Council proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

1. Prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle from proceeding along any road or length of road specified in Part I of the following table except for certain permitted purposes which include the conveyance of goods to or from premises situated on or adjacent to any of those roads, for the purposes of agriculture on land accessible from and only from any of those roads or for the garaging, servicing or repairing of a vehicle at premises accessible from and only from any of those roads.
2. Revoke the Traffic Regulation Order specified in column 1 of Part II of the following table to the extent specified or referred to in column 2 of that part of that table.

7. *Old Great North Road*, from a point 15 metres north of its junction with High Street for a distance of 140 metres in a southerly direction.
8. Road linking Old Great North Road and High Street (opposite "Belmont").

**PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990**

*Extension of the boundaries of a Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Havant, being the District Planning Authority for the Borough, hereby give notice of the designation of extensions to boundaries of an existing Conservation Area under section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, encompassing parts of the Borough which they have determined as areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, namely extensions to the existing Emsworth Conservation Area.

A map, more precisely showing the area of extension may be inspected during normal office hours at the Department of Environmental Services, Civic Offices, Civic Centre Road, Havant, at any time after publication of this notice.

The effect of designation of the extensions to the boundaries of the Conservation Area is that special attention is to be paid within the areas of extension (as in the original Conservation Area) to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area in the exercise of relevant statutory provisions and that certain special control is applied to it; so that, for example, any application for planning permission as to development which would affect its character or appearance must be specially advertised and notified, consent is required from the local planning authority to the demolition of any building in the area, trees in the area are especially protected and special forms of advertisement control may be applied. This is a summary of a number of extensive statutory provisions and any person wishing to be advised of the implications for a particular proposed development is advised to make enquiries to the Council's Director of Environmental Services, at the address above.
