TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Stopping-up of a length of The Fields at its junction with Hazzards Hill, Mere

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Wiltshire) (No. SW7) Order 1992", authorising the closure of the junction of The Fields with Hazzards Hill, Mere, Wincanton, to enable the development authorised in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out and requiring the provision of a new highway, which shall be a road

maintainable at the public expense for which the Highway Authority is to be the Wiltshire County Council.
