LONDON BOROUGH OF HARINGEY

The Haringey (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 63) Order 1992

Notice is hereby that, the Council of the London Borough of Haringey made the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The general effect of the Order will be to amend the Haringey (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1978, so as to revoke existing waiting restrictions in Woodside Gardens, London N.17.

The prohibitions referred to in the above paragraph do not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g. the picking up or setting down of passengers, the carrying out of statutory powers or duties, the taking in of petrol from road side petrol stations; to licenced street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled persons' "orange badge" does apply.
