- (ii) British Coal Opencast Executive Offices at Onllwyn Disposal Point, Onllwyn, Neath.
- (iii) Onllwyn Community Centre, Banwen, Neath.
- 4. There are no alternative rights of way.
- 5. Written objections, stating the grounds on which objections are made may be sent by any person to the Secretary of State before 24th December 1992 at the Welsh Office (Legal Division), Cathays Park, Cardiff CF1 3NQ (quoting ref: PP83/4). If the district council or county council in whose area the right of way lies object and do not withdraw their objection the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry; if any other person objects and does not withdraw his/her objection he/she may arrange a public inquiry if he/she sees fit.
