The general effect of the Order is to prohibit any person from carrying out the operations specified in Schedule 2 to the Order on the land described in Schedule 1. In certain circumstances this prohibition does not apply. These circumstances are set out in section 29 of the Act.

The Order took effect when it was made and will cease to have effect 9 months after it was made unless the Secretary of State previously gives notice that he has considered it and does not propose to amend or revoke it or that he has amended or revoked it.

They should be in writing and should state the title of the Order. In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should be stated.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Sawston Hall Meadows (Cambridgeshire) Nature Conservation Order 1992

Whereas the land which is hereinafter described is in the opinion of the Secretary of State for the Environment of special interest and of national importance by reason of it being a species rich fen meadow and calcareus grassland community.

And whereas it appears to the Secretary of State expedient to apply section 29(3) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to the said land for the purpose of conserving the fen meadow and calcareous grassland community with its associated flora and fauna.

And whereas the Secretary of State has consulted the Nature Conservancy Council for England.

Now therefore the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(1) and (3) of the said Act of 1981 hereby orders as follows:

- section 29(3) of the said Act of 1981 shall apply to the land descibed in Schedule 1 hereto and shown hatched and edged black on the map annexed to that Schedule and marked "Map Referred To In The Sawston Hall Meadows (Cambridgeshire) Nature Conservation Order 1992".
- The operations specified in Schedule 2 hereto appear to the Secretary of State to be likley to destroy the fen meadow and calcareous grassland community with its associated flora and fauna.

This Order may be cited as the Sawston Hall Meadows (Cambridgeshire) Nature Conservation Order 1992.

SCHEDULE 2

Specified Operations

Cultivation, including ploughing, rotovating, harrowing and reseeding.

Changes in the grazing regime, including type of stock or level or seasonal pattern or grazing and cessation or grazing.

Changes in stock feeding practice.

Introduction of mowing or other methods of cutting vegetation.

Application of manure, fertilisers and lime

Application of pesticides, including herbicides (weedkillers). Dumping, spreading or discharge of any waste materials. Burning of vegetation.

The introduction of any wild or domestic animal, plant or seed.

The destruction, removal or pruning of any plant or plant reamains.

Tree planting, including afforestation.

Use of vehicles or craft likely to damage features of interest.

Recreational or other activities within the control of the owner or occupier likely to damage features of interest. (17 SI)
