Parchment Street, Winchester—Residents' Street Parking and 20 m.p.h. Speed Limit Zone with Road Humps

Notice is hereby given that Hampshire County Council proposes making two Road Traffic Regulation Orders and introducing a traffic calming scheme as follows:-

Effect of Orders/Scheme: To implement the following measures in that length of Parchment Street, Winchester between its junction with North Walls and its junction with St. George's Street:

Residents' Parking/Prohibition of Waiting: The provision of street parking places in Parchment Street:

- (i) North-west side, between property Nos. 27 and 29;
- (ii) South-east side, between property Nos. 54 and 58;
- (iii) South-east side, between property Nos. 62 and 66;
- (iv) South-east side, between property Nos. 68 and 70;

Only vehicles displaying a permit may be parked in the parking places, although exemptions will be included to enable vehicles to wait for the following purposes—to board or alight, loading/unloading of furniture, building operations, removal of obstructions, statutory undertakers works, statutory powers and duties, postal collections/deliveries, emergency services vehicles and disabled drivers' parking.

Any resident of that length of Parchment Street between North Walls and St. George's Street may apply to Winchester City Council for the issue of a permit, subject to no more that one permit being issued in respect of any one household. The charge for permits will be £10 per annum per permit. Permits issued to residents of Parchment Street will not be valid for use in any other street and permits issued to residents of any street other than Parchment Street will not be valid for use in Parchment Street.

In addition, business permits will be available at £30 per annum for any business premises in Parchment Street between North Walls and St. George's Street, where it can be demonstrated that there is not sufficient off-street parking available to adequately meet the business needs of the particular business and subject to no more than one permit being issued to any one business. A business permit will be valid for parking up to one hour and will not be valid for use by any person employed at the business premises concerned.

Except where street parking places are provided waiting will be prohibited at all times.

20 m.p.h. Speed Limit Zone/Road Humps: A 20 m.p.h. speed limit will be imposed in that length of Parchment Street between North Walls and St. George's Street, an approximate distance of 283 metres.

The Speed Limit Order requires the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport which he has indicated can only be given, in the first instance, for a period of 18 months. The Order will therefore cease to be in force 18 months after it comes into operation. The County Council expect to be in a position to apply for consent to an indefinite extension of the speed limit 3 months before the Order is due to expire.

In conjunction with the making of the speed limit Order the Council is proposing to implement a traffic calming scheme in Parchment Street including the provision of a system of 3 road humps. Road humps are artificial humps in or on the surface of the highway which are designed to control the speed of vehicles.

The road humps proposed for Parchment Street are of the flat-top type extending from kerb to kerb and will be provided at each of the following locations:

- (i) Between a point 6 metres south of its junction with North Walls and a point 4-5 metres south of that point (ie.adjacent to the frontage of the Foresters Arms);
- (ii) Between a point 94.5 metres south of its junction with North Walls and a point 4.5 metres south of that point (ie extending along the frontage of property No. 50);
- (iii) Between a point 235.5 metres south of its junction with North Walls and a point 4.5 metres south of that point (ie adjacent to the frontage of property No. 9).

Each hump will be between 50 mm. and 100 mm. in height to suit the existing kerb height in each location.
