W E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Lieutenant and Deputy Lieutenants of the County of Middlefex, and City and Liberty of Westminster, beg leave upon our first Publick Meeting to Congratulate your Majefly upon your fafe and peaceable Acceffion to your un-doubted Right. We receive the Invaluable Bleffing with all she proper Sentiments of und fembled Joy, Affection and Zzal.

Our Joy is the Joy of Men whole pall Fears heighten their prefent Sati faction : Fears which have no other Proof that they were imaginary, but that Providence hath been much more merciful to us than we could in reason expect.

The Liberty and Happmess of Mankind was the glorious Cause, and the glorious End of that Revolution which transmitted to us our prefent Security. Madrid, April 1. The 26th paft the King declared his Refolution to take the P ince of Afturias out of the Tuition and Care of Women, and to establish a Houshold for him of Men. Accordingly, the Cardinal del Giudice, his Governor, is removed to the Palace of Buenretiro, into an Apartment next that of his Highnefs; the Marquiffes of Balero and Solera are appointed Gentlemen of his Bed Chamber, the Marquiffes of Villagarcia and Valoufe are named his Mayordomos, to ach weekly in Turn, and Father Marin a Jefuite is made his Confeffour. The Council of Cafile has been affembled extraordinarily, to examine the Bull by which the Pope has suppressed the Tribunal of the Monarchy of Sicily. The King has nominated the Marquis de los Balbafes to be of his Council of State. Let ers of the 23d paft from Bareelona relate, that the Expedition against Majorca was further delayed, upon a Resolution newly taken to imbark a greater Number of Horse than was at first defigned, and to wait till their Room be supplied by orher Cavalry, which was ordered to move from Valencia and Arragon into Catalonia, to keep the People in awe, who had threatned to make fome new Commotion; of which the Government of that Principality being informed, they cauled the famous Miquelet Moragas, and fome of his Adherents to be feized, and will proceed against them with the utmost Rigour.

Stockholm, March 26. The 24th of this Month being appointed tor folemnizing the Marrisge of the Princels Ulrica Eleanora with the hereditary Prince of Heffe-Caffel, the nuptial Ceremonies were privately performed that Night about 10 a Clock by the Archbilhop of Upfal, in the Queen-Grandmother's Apartments; there being, belides the Principal Officers and Ladies of the Court, no other Perfons admitted but the Senators and their Ladies, with the Swedifh Generals and the Colonel of the King's Guards, his Majesty's Attorney and Advocate General, and the Secretaries of State; and of the Prince's Retinue only Lieutenant General Ranck, Brigadier Verschuur, and Colonel Cutfleben. Yesterday in the Asternoon the Prince and Princess received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Quality, in their own Apartments, the Prince being now removed into those which were formerly the King's. Last Night there was a splendid Entertainment at Court, and a Ball which held till this Morning; not only the Senators with their Ladies and those of the Court, as also those of the other Perfons who were piefent at the Nuptials, but likewife the Foreign Ministers and almost all Perfons of Diffinction in Town being invited. At Supper, the Royal Family fat at a round Table at the upper End of the great Hall of the Court, to the Right and Left of which two other Tables were joined, where the Senators and their Ladies fat; and on each Side below were two other long Tables placed, for the Court Ladies and others. After Supper, the Prince, Princess and Duke of Holstein, danced about two Hours and then retired. Letters from Orground and the Places fituate on the Bothnick Gulph, do all give an Account of great Fires having for two or three Days together been seen upon the Isle of Aland and the Coaft of Finland, whence they conclude that the Muscovites have begun to burn and destroy the Towns and Villages both on that Island and on the Con-The Troops commanded by Major General tinent. Armfeldt, baving confumed all the Forage in the Province of Westerbothnia, are now removed into Helfingland. Great Diligence is used, as well here as at Carlscrona, in fitting out the Squadrons for the next Sum-mer's Service, but it cannot with any certainty be yet faid what time they will be ready to put to Sea.
