HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

City of Sunderland (Sunderland Eastern Relief Road A1018/B1294 Phase II—No. 2) (Classified Roads) (Side Roads) Order 1992

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed without modifications the above Order which was made by the City of Sunderland under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council to:

- (a) improve highways;
- (b) stop up highways;
- (c) construct new highways;

- (d) stop up private means of access to premises, and;
- (e) provide new means of access.

All on or in the vicinity of the classified road, the highways A1018 and B1294 which the Council propose to construct from the junction of High Street West and West Wear Street, in a southerly direction, to and including a new roundabout at its junction with Borough Road and then in a south-easterly direction to and including a new roundabout at its junction with Hendon Road and Lawrence Street.

Copies of the Order (as confirmed), and of the relevant plan may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at the offices of Sunderland City Council, Department of Administration, Civic Centre, Sunderland; the Central Library, Sunderland, and at the Department of Transport, Northern Regional Office, Wellbar House, Gallowgate, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 15th March 1993, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
