DISEASES OF FISH ACT 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales, having reasonable grounds for suspecting that certain inland waters and land adjacent to them are infected areas, has made the Diseases of Fish (Designated Areas) (Wales) Order 1993.
