(i) prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time, on any day, along the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this notice and

(ii) prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the length of road specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice other than in the direction specified in column 2.

Exemptions in the Order permit any vehicle to wait for the purpose of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading; Post Office services; maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water or electricity; the pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in accordance with the current provisions for disabled persons' vehicles. An exemption is also contained for vehicles being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes in an emergency.
