#### *London Building (Dangerous Structures Fees and Expenses)* *(Islington) By-laws 1993*

Notice is hereby given pursuant to section 8 of the London Building Act (Amendment) Act 1935 that the Council of the London Borough of Islington are proposing to make a byelaw varying the fees to be charged by the Council in relation to dangerous and neglected structures.
