SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

Suffolk County Council (Parish of Aldringham-cum-Thorpe) (Remembrance Road, The Haven and The Dunes) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1993.

Notice is hereby given that on 21st June 1993, Suffolk County Council made the above Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time between 1st May and 30th September, on the lengths of road specified in the schedule to this notice.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to board or alight; goods to be loaded or unloaded; for building, industrial or demolition works; for the maintenance of the road or the services therein, and for certain other purposes specified in the Order. There are also the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles.

A copy of the Order which comes into effect on 29th June 1993, and a plan showing the roads affected, may be inspected at the offices of the East Area Surveyor, County Buildings, Street Farm Road, Saxmundham, between 8.45 a.m. to 5.15 p.m., Monday to Thursday and between 8.45 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. on Friday.
