The Kent County Council (Herne Bay) (Traffic Regulation) (Amendment No. 12) Order 1993

Notice is hereby given that the Kent County Council proposes to make the above Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and 4(2), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The proposed Order will have the effect of:

(1) including in The Canterbury City Council (Herne Bay) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1988 the provisions of The Canterbury City Council (Central Area, Herne Bay) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1988, and substituting an alternative form of wording, without altering any of the existing provisions, conditions or exemptions currently applicable,

Except that the current fee for a residents' permit will be confirmed at £18.75 per annum; residents' permits will become renewable on 1st January each year; the Articles concerning disabled persons will be revised to take account of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1991; restrictions which do not apply on Sundays will also not apply on Bank Holidays

- (2) providing bus stop clearways (7 a.m. to 7 p.m.) at marked bus stops in Herne Street; Canterbury Road; High Street; Sea Street and Station Road;
- (3) additionally prohibiting waiting at all times in Albion Lane (both sides for 14 metres from Canterbury Road);
- (4) additionally prohibiting waiting between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays in William Street (east side in front

of Parish Church between 151 and 169 metres from Kings Road)

- (5) designating as on street parking places (1 hour limit with no return within 1 hour: 8.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. Monday to Saturday) (except residents' permit holders) all current 1 hour limited waiting areas listed in Third Schedule except for Reculver Road which will remain a limited waiting area;
- (6) additionally designating the following on street parking places; East Street, east side, between 11 and 38 metres south of Charles Street; Dolphin Street, east side, (i) between 10 and 20 metres north of High Street; (ii) between 10 and 20 metres south of Telford Street and (iii) between 10 and 37 metres south of Central Parade; Richmond Street, east side, (i) between 10 metres south of Central Parade and 10 metres north of Mortimer Street; and (ii) between 10 and 27 metres south of Mortimer Street; Station Road, east side, between 24 and 35 metres south of Central Parade;
- (7) providing that vehicles parking in William Street between 95 and 151 metres north of Kings Road will park at an angle to the kerb;
- (8) revoking the Fourth Schedule (Hackney Carriage Stands) which duplicates an Order made under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976
- (9) revoking tThe Canterbury City Council (Central Area, Herne Bay) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1988.
- (10) imposing a weight limit of three tonnes, with exemptions for access and goods vehicles loading, on Western Esplanade and Hampton Pier Avenue, between Ridgeway Cliff and Hampton Pier Åvenue.

- (a) vehicles proceeding in Dundas Street from making a left turn into Market Street,
- (b) vehicles proceeding in Market Street from making a left turn into High Street.
- 4. To remove the existing one-way traffic flow on Market Street from Dundas Street to High Street (i.e. this length of road will become two-way).
