The usual exceptions for disabled persons' vehicles are also included in the Order.

West Glamorgan County Council (Amendment to Residents' Parking Scheme) Order 1993

Proposed Waiting Restrictions on Oxford Place/Lower Park Road/Upper Park Road and Conyngham Road, Victoria Park

Notice is hereby given that the Manchester City Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order and its effects are:

The City of Manchester (Oxford Place, Lower Park Road, Upper Park Road and Conyngham Road, Victoria Park) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1993.

To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday on:

- Oxford Place*, south side for its full length.
