

The relevant notice of proposals was previously published pursuant to Regulation 6(1)(b) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1989 in Issue No. 53262 of *The London Gazette* dated 30th March 1993 under Ref. No. 736 and the effect of the Order is as so described in that notice and as set out below save as to such modifications (if any), as are so described.

The Order which comes into operation on 4th August 1993, makes it unlawful for any vehicle to proceed in Ranvilles Lane, through a point 38 metres south of its junction with the centre-line of Harcourt Road.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of road affected may be inspected at the office of the Chief Engineer at the Civic Offices, Civic Way, Fareham, during usual office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of 4th August 1993, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Ewenny Road (Route B4265) and Brynteg Avenue, Bridgend) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1993.

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the side of the length of road and length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the side of length of road and length of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, and a map showing the side of length of road and length of road to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Ogwr Borough Council, P.O. Box 4, Civic Offices, Angel Street, Bridgend and at the Mid Glamorgan County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 29th August 1993.

GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Gwent County Council (Castle Street and Vivian Street, Abertillery) (Prohibition of Waiting and Right-hand Turns) Order 1993.

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police have, on 5th August 1993 made the above Order, the effect of which will be:

(1) To revoke:

- (a) Items (i), (ii) and (iii) of Schedule 1 of Abertillery Urban (Various Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1974, as they relate to Castle Street.
- (b) The Gwent County Council (Castle Street, Abertillery, Route B4249) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1980.
- (c) The County Council of Gwent (Castle Street, Abertillery) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1987.
- (d) Item 4 of the County Council of Gwent (A467 Improvement—Abertillery to Heads of the Valleys Road) (Various Roads, Abertillery and Brynmawr) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1989, as it relates to Castle Street.

(2) To prohibit waiting at any time on those lengths of roads as set out in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions have been included in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers
- (b) loading or unloading goods
- (c) the maintenance of the roads
- (d) the supply of gas, water or electricity
- (e) for emergency purposes
- (f) Local Authority duties.

(3) To introduce a prohibition of right-hand turns into Castle Street by vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes.

The alternative route is via Castle Street, High Street, Bywater Row, Princess Street, Cwmcottage Road, Alexandra Road, Vivian Street and Castle Street.

The Order will come into operation on 6th August 1993.

The Order and a map showing the affected roads may be inspected at the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 5th August 1993, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
