RADIOACTIVE SUBSTANCES ACT 1960

Applications by Nuclear Electric plc to Dispose of Radioactive Waste

The Chief Inspector of Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Pollution (HMIP) and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food are considering an application from Nuclear Electric plc, in accordance with the Radioactive Substances Act 1960, to dispose of gaseous, liquid and combustible radioactive waste from their premises at Sizewell B Nuclear Power Station, Sizewell, near Leiston, in the county of Suffolk.

LAW OF PROPERTY ACT 1925, SECTION 194

Application for Temporary Fencing on Broughton Gifford and Norrington Commons, Broughton Gifford, West Wiltshire

Notice is hereby given that Dr. C. J. Gossop, BSc MA PhD MRTPI, an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for the Environment, will attend at Broughton Gifford Village Hall, Broughton Gifford, near Melksham, Wiltshire, on Tuesday, 7th September 1993, to hold a public local inquiry into an application by Broughton Gifford Parish Council for consent under section 194 of the Law of Property Act 1925 to the erection of temporary fencing on Broughton Gifford and Norrington Commons, comprising:

1. Single strand wire fence around the perimeter of the football and cricket pitches on Broughton Gifford Common, comprising an area of 2 hectares or thereabouts;
2. Wooden fences around saplings and young trees on Broughton Gifford Common;
3. Single strand wire fence on Broughton Gifford Common from time to time and from place to place but not enclosing at any time more than 2 hectares;
4. Single strand wire fence on Norrington Common, but not at any time enclosing more than 1 hectare, between 1st April and 31st October in any year.

The inquiry will begin at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 7th September 1993 and there will be an evening session at 7 p.m. on that date.

It is desirable that all persons interested should attend the inquiry. Any person desirous of being heard on the subject matter of the application, whether considered in relation to the benefit of the neighbourhood or to private interests, may, at the discretion of the Inspector, give evidence at the inquiry or may arrange for someone to do so on his behalf on the date mentioned above. - (ii) the applicant's statement in support of the application; and
- (iii) a plan showing the common land affected and details of the proposals.

The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Cambridgeshire) (No.) Order 19

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 248 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and section 125 of the Highways Act 1980 which will authorise the stopping-up of lengths of highway at, and private means of access to, Bendbow Rise, Leicester, in the interests of road safety and to facilitate the movement of traffic on Bendbow Rise, which is a highway to be improved in accordance with permitted development under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and article 3 and Part 13 of Schedule 2 to the Town and Country Planning Development Order 1988.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the permitted development by Leicestershire County Council.

The proposed Order will require the provision of new highways maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Leicestershire County Council, and the improvement of existing highways. The proposed Order will also require the provision of new means of access to premises.
