HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Realignment of Lletty Turner Bends, Mountain Ash) (Route A4059, Abercynon (A470) to Penderyn) (Side Roads) Order 1993.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by the County Council of Dyfed under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter a highway;
- (b) to stop-up a highway;
- (c) to construct a new highway;
- (d) to stop-up a length of private means of access;
- (e) to provide a new private means of access,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council are proposing to construct at Mountain Ash.

within 6 weeks of 16th August 1993 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Lancashire County Council (Squires Gate Link Road Phase 2 Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1992

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed with modifications the Lancashire County Council (Squires Gate Link Road Phase 2 Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1992 which was made by Lancashire County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to carry out the improvement of highways,
- (b) to stop up highways,
- (c) to construct new highways,
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (e) to provide a new means of access to premises,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the Classified Road which the Council propose to (a) construct from the eastern boundary of Common Edge Road at its junction with Squires Gate Lane, in an easterly then northerly direction to a point 166 metres south of the existing roundabout junction of Yeadon Way, Ashworth Road, Squires Gate Link Road Phase 1 and Brunel Way; and (b) to improve from a point 166 metres south of the aforesaid roundabout junction to the southern boundary of that junction.
