The A55 Trunk Road (Lay-bys, Penmaenmawr By-pass, Gwynedd)
(Restriction of Waiting) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to restrict (with certain exemptions) the waiting of any vehicle in either of the lay-bys described in the Schedule to this Notice to a maximum period of 4 hours in any period of 5 hours.

The lay-bys are located on that length of the A55 Chester-Bangor Trunk Road, known as the Penmaenmawr By-pass in the County of Gwynedd and are:

- the lay-by adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road situated approximately 50 metres west of the centreline of the Red Gables Viaduct;
- the lay-by adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road situated approximately 136 metres west of the centreline of the Red Gables Viaduct. (486)
