### The London Borough of Hounslow (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1993.

## Brentford Parking Scheme

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hounslow on 23rd August 1993, made the following Orders:

- (a) the Hounslow (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1993 under sections 45, 46 and 49 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended); and
- (b) the Hounslow (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 69) Order 1993, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the aforementioned Act of 1984.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to impose a system of controlled parking in the streets or parts of streets in Brentford specified in Schedule 1, Schedule 2 and Schedule 3 of this notice (hereinafter referred to as "the controlled area").

3. The general effect of the Parking Places Order will be to:

- (a) designate parking places on the highway specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this notice at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places and provides that the type of parking place so designated will be as set out in column 2 of that Schedule;
- (b) provides that the parking places will operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (c) specifies, in resepct of the metered parking places, that passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages may be left therein;

(d) specifies that:

(i) in the metered, 2-hour parking places, the initial charge will be at the rate of 20 pence for 30 minutes and the maximum initial period will be 2 hours;

(ii) in the ticket parking metered, 2-hour parking places, the initial charge will be at the rate of 20 pence for 30 minutes and the maximum initial period will be 2 hours;

(iii) in respect of the metered 2-hour and ticket parking meterd 2-hour parking places the excess charge—payable to the Borough Council—will be £18; the excess charge period will be 1 hour; the unexpired time on a parking meter may be used free of charge and the period during which a vehicle may not return to a parking place will be 1 hour;

(e) provides that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board and alight (maximum 2 munutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes).

4. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order will be further to amend the Hounslow (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977 so that:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the streets or parts of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this notice;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place will be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in the streets or parts of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above;
- (c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the streets or parts of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (b) above, will be prohibited unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Hounslow Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;
