Designation of Shalden as a Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of East Hampshire in pursuance of powers conferred on them by section 69 of the Planning (Listed Building and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 have designated a further area as a Conservation Area at Shalden, in Hampshire. The Area covered being so designated by the Council on 4th August 1993. The Conservation Area covers the following areas of the land:

Land to the north-west of Shalden Common running along the main village lane from the south-west to the north as far as Southwood Road.

With very few exceptions buildings within the Conservation Area may not be demolished except with the consent of the Local Planning Authority, and there are other special controls relating to extensions and alterations. With very few limited exceptions trees may not be topped, lopped, felled, uprooted or wilfully damaged or destroyed, unless notice of this proposed action has been given to the Local Planning Authority and permission to proceed has been received from them or they have failed to take conclusive action regarding the notice within 6 weeks from the time it was served. Trees already included in any Tree Preservation Orders are not subject to this procedure, but are subject, instead, to the more stringent requirements of the appropriate Order.

A plan showing the precise extent of the Conservation Area is available for public inspection between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Fridays, at the Main Reception Desk of the Development Services Division, East Hampshire District Council, Penns Place, Petersfield.
