Notice of application for licence to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority, Yorkshire Region, by Dales Water Services Ltd., Witherwick Lane, Melmerby, Ripon, North Yorkshire HG4 5JB, on behalf of Mrs. A. Pearson, Cawder Hall, Cawder Lane, Skipton, North Yorkshire, for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from a borehole in the millstone grit strata at NGR SD998503, Cawder Hall, in the civil parish of Skipton, Craven District, North Yorkshire: 250,000 gallons per annum, 2,000 gallons per day, 400 gallons per hour. The water is required for a domestic supply to Cawder Hall and letting cottages.

A copy of the application and of any map, plan or other document submitted with it may be inspected, free of charge, at Cawder Hall, Cawder Lane, Skipton, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 8th October 1993 and ending on 5th November 1993.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

City of Bristol, Traffic Orders, Pay and Display Parking

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon proposes to make an Order under sections 45, 46, 49, 51 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended the effect of which will be:
