The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act, which will authorise the stopping-up of Hurstbourne, Claygate in the County of Surrey.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to the Orbit Housing Association by Elmbridge Borough Council on 7th July 1993 under ref. EL/93/0213.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during the 28 days commencing on 13th October 1993 at the Elmbridge Borough Council Offices, Civic Centre, High Street, Esher, and may be obtained free of charge from the Department of Transport (quoting ref. During the above-mentioned period of 28 days anyone may object to the making of the Order by writing to the Secretary of State, quoting ref. In the preparation of an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection may be communicated to the applicant and other people who may be affected by it.

Proposed stopping-up of four lengths of footway and two areas of highway land in Bellamy Avenue and Gibbsfold Road, Hartcliffe

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of four lengths of footway and two areas of highway land in Bellamy Avenue and Gibbsfold Road, Hartcliffe in the City of Bristol.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission referred to in that Schedule.

The proposed Order will provide that the stopping-up must not be carried out until footways and a highway have been provided as a condition of the Order and that the footways and a highway shall be highways maintainable at the public expense for which the Avon County Council will be the local highway authority.
