WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under section 29 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, made the Lindisfarne (Northumberland) Nature Conservation Order 1993, applying section 29(3) of the Act to the lands described in Schedule 1 to the Order and specifying the operation described in Schedule 2 to the Order which appears to the Secretary of State likely to destroy or damage the coastal habitat and associated fauna including bird populations by reason of which the site is of special interest and national importance. The Order is reproduced in the annex to this notice.

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit any person from carrying out the operation specified in Schedule 2 to the Order on the land described in Schedule 1. In certain circumstances this prohibition does not apply. These circumstances are set out in section 29 of the Act.

The Order took effect when it was made and will cease to have effect 9 months after it was made unless the Secretary of State previously gives notice that he has considered it and does not propose to amend or revoke it or that he has amended or revoked it.

Representations about or objections to the Order may be made to the Secretary of State for the Environment (Wildlife Division), Room 908, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol BS2 9DJ, before 19th November 1993. They should be in writing and should state the title of the Order. In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should be stated.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to in it have been deposited at the offices of the Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough

Council, Council Offices, Wallace Green, Berwick-upon-Tweed TD15 1ED. They may be seen, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Lindisfarne (Northumberland) Nature Conservation Order 1993

Whereas the land which is hereinafter described is in the opinion of the Secretary of State for the Environment of special interest and of national importance by reason of it being a coastal habitat with associated fauna, including nationally and internationally important populations of birds.

And whereas it appears to the Secretary of State expedient to apply section 29(3) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to the said land for the purpose of conserving the coastal habitat with its associated fauna including bird populations and for the purpose of complying with an international obligation.

And whereas the Secretary of State has consulted the Nature Conservancy Council for England.

Now therefore the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(1) and (3) of the said Act of 1981 hereby orders as follows:

1. Section 29(3) of the said Act of 1981 shall apply to the land described in Schedule 1 hereto and shown hatched and edged black on the map and marked "Map Referred to in the Lindisfarne (Northumberland) Nature Conservation Order 1993".
2. The operations specified in Schedule 2 hereto appear to the Secretary of State to be likely to destroy or damage the said coastal habitat and associated fauna including bird populations.

This Order may be cited as the Lindisfarne (Northumberland) Nature Conservation Order 1993.

Description of Land

All that area situated within Budle Bay, in the area of the Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough Council in the County of Northumberland shown hatched and edged black on the map.
