Westminster, July 23.

IS Majefty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers; and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the ufual Solemnity, Sir William Oldes, Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers. Bruffels, July 20. The Marquis de Miraval, Ambaffador of Spain to the States General, arrived here fome Days ago from France, and proceeded on his Journey to the Hague. He was not received here with any Ceremony, but at Mons (where there is a Dutch Garrifon) he was faluted with Cannon, and had Sentinels placed at his Door. He had alfo Sentinels at Antwerp, by M. Vandenbergh's Orders to the commanding Officer of the Dutch Battallion there. Count Maldeghem returned hither laft Night from having demanded the Subfidy of the States of Flanders, and there is ground to hope that those States will give a Supply proportioned to the Neceflities of the Service: They have already promifed to accept the Affignments made to those who have advanced the three Months Pay which they are in Arrear to the Walloon Troops on their Repartition, and this will encourage those Perfons to give those Troops Credit for their further Subfignance.
