## A PROCLAMATION,

For Suppressing Rebellions, and Rebellious Tumults.

GEORGE R.

Hereas of late some of the meanest of Our People have been, in divers Parts of this Kingdom, Seduced and Stirred up to Riots and Tumults, to the Disturbance of the Publick Peace, and the same are now carried into Open Rebellion, and a Levying of War against Us, and our Royal Authority, by the said Rebels, baving not only Delared the End of their Rising in Arms to be to a General Purpose, and that against Law, but even Proceeded with an Armed Force, in many and distant Places, to Pull Down, Burn, and Destroy the Houses and Buildings of Our Good and Peace, able Subjects, and by their baving Declared for the Presender, and actually Resisted and Engaged with Force of Arms such as by Lawful Authority were Endeavouring to Disperse them; and there is no Room to Doubs but these Traiterous Proceedings are Promoted and Encouraged by Papists, Non-furors, and other Persons Disassett our Govern ment, in Expectation of being Supported from Abroad: We have therefore thought sit, for the Suppession, by and with the Advice of our Privy-Council, to Isue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby Declaring, that all Our Oficers, Civil and Military, are, by the Duty of their several Ofices and Commands, obliged to use their several Oficer, hereforce of such Oficer, if the Presence of such Oficer and Asserbed Such Oficer Results of the Such Oficer, if the Presence of such Oficer, if the Presence of such Oficer cannot be had, or if such Officer Results or Neglects to Execute his Duty; And that all Our Dutiful and Loyal Subjects may, without any Express Warrant or Authority, At in Defence of their Houses, Persons, or Possibles may, without any Express Warrant or Authority, At in Defence of their Houses, Persons, or Possibles happen to be Slain, e

or oth r our Loyal Subjects. Asting, as aforefaid, in Defence of the Laws, of Our Royal Authority, and the Irefervation of the Publick Peace, such Killing is Justifiable, and they who do it are Indemnified by Law. And We therefore strilly Charge and Command all our Officers, as well Civil as Military, and all other Our Obedient and Loyal Subjects, That where soever they shall meet with the said Rebels and Traitors, so, as aforesaid, in Armand Open Rebellion against Us, they do Endeavour, without Delay, to suppress them with their Utmost Force, and to Treat them with that Severity with which Rebels and Traytors, sound in Astual War and Rebellion against the Crown, may be Treated.
