TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-up of Highways (former Bargoed Colliery, Bargoed, Mid Glamorgan) Order 1994

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he had made an Order under sections 247 and 248 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the length of highway described at:

- 1 of the Schedule to this notice, to enable development consisting of land reclamation, for which planning permission has been granted under Part III of the said Act, to be carried out; and
- 2 of the Schedule, to facilitate the movement of traffic on and in the interests of the safety of the users of the main highway, which is a highway to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted as above.

Copies of the Order may be inspected during office hours at the offices of Rhymney Valley District Council, Council Offices, Ystrad

Fawr, Ystrad Mynach, Mid Glamorgan during a period of 6 weeks from 21st January 1994.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act

he may within 6 weeks of 21st January 1994 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(all distances are approximate)

The highways to be stopped up are at the former Bargoed Colliery Site, Bargoed in the county of Mid Glamorgan and are:

1. that length of highway, known as Angel Lane, which extends from a point 310 metres south-west of its junction with the A4049 (Pengam Road) in a northerly direction for a distance of 546 metres; and
2. that length of unnamed highway north of Duffryn Street, Aberbargoed, which extends from a point 166 metres west of its junction with the A4049 (Commercial Street) in a westerly direction for a distance of 28 metres. (482)

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The A55 Trunk Road (Eastbound Carriageway, Pen-Y-Clip Section, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 199

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit pedestrians from proceeding in the eastbound carriageway of the length of trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Notice. An exemption will, however, be provided to enable pedestrians to cross the trunk road at Penmaenmawr West Junction.

A copy of the proposed Order together with a plan and a statement of reasons for the making of the proposed Order, may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at the offices of Aberconwy Borough Council, Council Offices, Bodlondeb, Conwy, Gwynedd, during a period of 21 days from 21st January 1994.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, and quoting ref. ZC 510-2-4-80 must be sent in writing to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division,
