The plan became operative on 7th February 1994, but if any person aggrieved by the plan desires to question its validity, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or that any requirement of the said Part II or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the plan, he may, within 6 weeks from 11th February 1994, make an application to the High Court under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The Worthing Local Plan has been adopted under the old development plan system, and, therefore, the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and the associated regulations.
