NATIONAL RIVERS AUTHORITY

Notice of application for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of an inland water by means of impounding works

Take notice that C. E. Talbot & Son, of Shenstone House Farm, Shenstone, Kidderminster, Worcestershire DY10 4DH, is applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of a small unnamed tributary of the Elmley Brook, at National Grid Reference SO 8690 7260 at Shenstone House Farm, Kidderminster, Worcestershire DY10 4DH.

Water will be impounded by means of a small embankment across the line of the pipe and the object of the impounding works is to create a pond for conservation and angling purposes.

The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 6800 cubic metres.

The pond will be filled initially during the months October to March—overflow will be back into the watercourse system.

A copy of the application and any map, plans and other documents submitted with it may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at Shenstone House Farm, Shenstone, Kidderminster, Worcestershire DY10 4DH, between 6th May and 6th June 1994.

BARNSELEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT 1993

The Proposed Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council (West Barnsley) Smoke Control Order No. 65 1994

Notice is hereby given: that the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 18 of the Clean Air Act 1993 intend to make an Order entitled the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council (West Barnsley) Smoke Control Order No. 65 1994 declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 21 of the Clean Air Act 1993 if on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and certain other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If made, the Order will not come into operation before 31st March 1995 or before a later date determined by the Council. Copies of the proposed Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, at the offices of Environmental Health Services, Regent House, Regent Street, Barnsley, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 13th May 1994.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the proposed Order may by notice to the Head of Environmental Health Services, Regent House, Regent Street, Barnsley, object to the making of the Order.

CHESTER CITY COUNCIL

The Council of the City of Chester (Residents and Designated Parking Places) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Chester propose to introduce a Residents and Designated Parking Places Order on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

The effect of the Order will be:

1. To introduce an initial waiting period within the lengths of road detailed in the Schedule, during the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, for people to leave motor cars and car derived vans for a maximum period of 10 minutes for an initial charge of £Nil.
2. To introduce an Excess Charge of £25 payable when the Order is contravened by a person leaving a vehicle during the period described above in a designated parking place:
 - (i) for longer than the initial period, and
 - (ii) where the vehicle is not displaying a valid Residents Permit or is left other than in accordance with the provisions of the Order.

No restriction is placed on Disabled Drivers who display a valid disabled persons badge and parking disc.

3. To revoke the existing parking Order entitled the Council of the City of Chester (Residential and Designated Parking Places) (Modified) Order 1993, and incorporate the lengths of road specified in that Order into this proposed Order.
