A PROCLAMATION

Appointing Monday, 2nd January 1995, and Monday, 8th May 1995 as Bank Holidays in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and appointing Tuesday, 27th December 1994, Monday, 8th May 1995, and Monday, 29th May 1995, as Bank Holidays in Scotland.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Monday, the second day of January and Monday, the eighth day of May in the year 1995, should be bank holidays in England, Wales and Northern Ireland:

And whereas We consider it desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December in the year 1994 and Monday, the eighth day of May and Monday, the twenty-ninth day of May in the year 1995 should be bank holidays in Scotland:

Now, therefore, We, in pursuance of section 1(3) of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971, do hereby appoint Monday, the second day of January and Monday, the eighth day of May in the year 1995 to be bank holidays in England, Wales and Northern

Ireland and Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December in the year 1994 and Monday, the eighth day of May and Monday, the twenty-ninth day of May in the year 1995 to be bank holidays in Scotland.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this twenty-second day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety-four and in the forty-third year of Our Reign.
