Notice of application for consent in pursuance of Schedule 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991, that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority, Anglian Region by Tarmac Roadstone (Southern) Limited, for consent to discharge trade effluent derived from mineral processing and washing from Ingham Quarry at Park Farm, Ingham, Suffolk. The application is for a maximum volume of 2,500 cubic metres per day at a maximum rate of 27 litres per second. The discharge is to be made to a drainage stream at National Grid Reference TL 8520 6925 which joins Culford Stream. The uses of Culford Stream include a Salmonid fishery. The discharge will be within the areas of St. Edmundsbury Borough Council and Suffolk County Council.

Notice of application for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of an inland water by means of impounding works

Take notice that N. R. and P. J. Haywood, of Bearhurst Farm, Stonegate, East Sussex, is applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of a tributary to the River Rother at National Grid Reference TQ 6745 2755 NE at Bearhurst Farm, Parish of Ticehurst, East Sussex. Water will be impounded by Clay Dam and the object of the impounding works is Conservation. [The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 1,680 cubic metres].

Notice of application for consent in pursuance of Schedule 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991, that a discharge application has been made to the National Rivers Authority Region by Anglian Water Services Ltd. for a new discharge of up to 864 cubic metres per day of storm and emergency sewage effluent from Church Street, Terminal Pumping Station, Long Bennington, Lincolnshire. The discharge is to be made to the Base Drain, at National Grid Reference SK 8433 4418. The new discharge will reduce the frequency of operation of the existing overflow from this pumping station (up to 432 cubic metres per day of storm and emergency sewage effluent) which discharges to an unnamed dyke adjacent to the pumping station (National Grid Reference SK 8424 4411). The new and existing discharges are located within the Southern Kesteven District Council area.
