MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL**Mid Glamorgan County Council (Various Streets, Treforest) (Prohibition of Waiting, Limited Waiting, Residents Only Parking and One Way Traffic) Orders 1994.**

Notice is hereby given that on 4th July 1994, the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2, 4, 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is:

1. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this notice other than in the direction specified in Column 2 to that Schedule.
2. No person shall cause any vehicle to wait at any time on the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.
3. No person shall cause any vehicle to wait for a period exceeding 2 hours with return prohibited within 4 hours on the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3A to this notice unless a valid residents only parking permit is displayed.
4. Persons who are eligible to apply for a residents parking permit are those whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in one of the roads specified in Schedule 3B to this notice.
5. No person shall cause any vehicle to wait at any time between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive in Park Close, Treforest with the exception of the lengths of road fronting the parking bays.
6. Nothing in Articles 2, 3 and 5 shall render it unlawful for emergency service vehicles to wait on the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of roads and for Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while on call. Vehicles are allowed to wait for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading, unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of roads, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge are allowed to wait up to 3 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour in relation to Article 2 above and at any time in relation to Article 3.

The Order came into operation on 7th July 1994, and a copy thereof and a map showing the lengths of road and sides of lengths of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 7th July 1994.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 4th July 1994, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
