The Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 3) Order 1994

The Croydon (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon, in association with the decriminalisation of parking offences, on 28th June 1994 made the above-mentioned Amendment Orders under the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Regulation (Parking) Act 1985 and sections 63 to 87 inclusive and Schedules 6 and 7 of the Road Traffic Act 1991.

- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to amend various existing Orders to delegate authority to Council Parking Attendants to issue penalty charge notices where they have reason to believe that:
 - (a) a vehicle has been left or been permitted to wait in a restricted street during the prescribed hours in which waiting or loading restrictions may be in force, or;
 - (b) a vehicle has been left in a designated parking place during the permitted hours for longer than the initial period for which payment was made by the initial charge, or;
 - (c) a vehicle has been left in a designated parking place in contravention of the articles of an existing Traffic Order, to which these Amendment Orders relate.
 - 3. The amount of the penalty charge will be:
 - (a) £40 in respect of any offence referred to in paragraph 2(a) above, payable to the Council within 28 days, reduced to £20 on early settlement of the payment within 14 days; or
 - (b) £30 in respect of any offence referred to in paragraph 2(b) or (c), payable to the Council within 28 days, reduced to £15 on early settlement of the payment within 14 days.
- 4. The Orders will further provide that where a parking attendant has reason to believe that a vehicle has been left or permitted to wait in a restricted street during the prescribed hours or in a designated parking place in contravention of any of the offences mentioned in paragraph 2, he or another person acting under his direction may fix an immobilisation device to the vehicle or may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the said street or parking place to a safe place of custody, until payment has been received of such charges the Council may be entitled to recover from the person responsible for release of the immobilisation device or for the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1991.

The Croydon (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon, on 27th June 1994, made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

- 2. The general effect of the Order, in association with the signalisation of the Bensham Lane/Handcroft Road/London Road junction, will be:
 - (a) to revoke the Croydon (Prescribed Routes) (No. 4) Traffic Order 1987, which introduced one-way working from south to north in Handcroft Road, Croydon between the southern end of the island site situated at the junction with London Road, and the northernmost junction of Handcroft Road with London Road;
 - (b) to prohibit vehicles proceeding in Bensham Lane in a southwesterly direction from turning right into London Road;
 - (c) to prohibit vehicles proceeding in Handcroft Road in a southerly direction from turning right into Dennett Road at the southern end of a new island site to be constructed;
 - (d) to prohibit vehicles proceeding in Dennett Road in a northeasterly direction from turning right into Handcroft Road;
 - (e) to prohibit vehicles proceeding in Handcroft Road in a northerly direction from turning right into London Road at the northern end of the new island site;
 - (f) to prohibit vehicles proceeding in London Road in a northwesterly direction to turn left into Handcroft Road.
- 3. The Prohibition and restrictions referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply to:
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform; or
 - (b) anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on a highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
