GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

(Commercial Road, Ruperra Street and South Market Street, Newport) (Traffic Regulation) Orders 1994

Notice is hereby given that, Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 propose to make the above Orders the general effect of which will be:

- 1. To provide a Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting Order to:
 - (i) prohibit waiting at any time on parts of Commercial Road and Ruperra Street, Newport;
 - (ii) restrict waiting to 1 hour (no return within 2 hours) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. (Mondays to Saturdays) on parts of Commercial Road, Newport.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to permit waiting for the following purposes:

(a) Picking up and setting down passengers.

- (b) Loading or unloading goods.

- 3. To provide a One-Way Traffic Order to prohibit vehicles from proceeding along South Market Street in a direction other than north-easterly i.e. from its junction with West Market Street to lower Dock Street.
- 4. To provide a Bus Stop (Clearway) Order to prohibit any vehicle other than a public service vehicle, as defined in the Order, from waiting between the hours of 7 a:m: and 7 p.m. on any day in bus bays to be provided on parts of Commercial Road, Newport.

- 5. To provide a *Goods Vehicle Parking Places Order* to prohibit any vehicles other than goods vehicles, tailers of hatchback motor cars, as defined in the Order, to wait in loading bays on parts of Commercial Road, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays, where waiting will be restricted to 1 hour (no return within 2 hours).
- 6. To revoke parts of: the County Council of Gwent (Pillgwenlly Area, Newport) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1991 and parts of the County Council of Gwent (Pillgwenlly Area, Newport) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1991.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which together with a map showing the restricted roads and a written statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the Offices of the Newport Borough Council, Civic Centre, Newport, Gwent and the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

GWYNEDD COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Gwynedd (Various Streets, Holyhead) (Traffic Management Order) 1994

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Gwynedd proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to 2(3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be:

- (1) To prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) To prohibit vehicles from travelling along the road specified in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto same in the direction specified in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto.

Exceptions will permit waiting on the sides of lengths of roads referred to in the First Schedule for:
