NEW ROADS AND STREET WORKS ACT

SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

NEW ROADS AND STREET WORKS ACT 1991, SECTION 58

Notice of Substantial Road Works

Three months' advance notice is hereby given that Suffolk County Council (Highway Authority) intends to carry out substantial works for road purposes.

2. The street in which these works will take place is: A14 Eastbound.

3. Work is expected to affect the carriageway on 3 No. sites:

Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990

Stopping-up Order Part of Fitzroy Street immediately in front of Main Entrance to the Grafton Centre, Cambridge
