SALFORD CITY COUNCIL

The City of Salford (Manchester Road West and Hazel Avenue, Little Hulton, Worsley) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that on 21st July 1994 the Council of the City of Salford, made the above mentioned Order under sections 1, 2, 4 and Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.

The effect of the Order is as described in the notice of proposal to make the Order which appeared in *The London Gazette* (Issue No. 58895), dated 16th April 1992, under ref. No. 535 in that it is unlawful to permit vehicular traffic to wait at any time on the length of road specified in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road affected are available for inspection at the Common Law Section, Salford Civic Centre, Chorley Road, Swinton M27 2AD, between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

- Manchester Road West, Little Hulton, Worsley, from a point 15 metres north-west of the north-westerly kerb-line of Hazel Avenue in a south-easterly direction to a point 15 metres south-east of the south-easterly kerb-line of Hazel Avenue.
- Hazel Avenue, Little Hulton, Worsley, both sides from the southwesterly kerb-line of Manchester Road West in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.
- The City of Salford (Stott Lane, Salford 6) (Revocation of Street Parking Places and Introduction of Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994.

Revocation of the City of Salford (Street Parking Places No. 1) (Order 1961) Variation Order 1970

Private motor cars and commercial vehicles, the unladen weight of which does not exceed 30 cwt. may wait in a single line with the nearside to the kerb.

Stott Lane, westerly side, commencing 100 lineal yards from Eccles Old Road and extending for 340 lineal yards in a southerly direction.

SCHEDULE 2

Introduction of no waiting at any time

- Stott Lane, west side, from a point 106 metres south of the southerly kerb-line of Eccles Old Road, in a southerly direction for a distance of 29 metres.
- Stott Lane, west side, from a point 194 metres south of the southerly kerb-line of Eccles Old Road, in a southerly direction for a distance of 46 metres.
- Stott Lane, west side, from a point 263 metres south of the southerly kerb-line of Eccles Old Road, in a southerly direction for a distance of 88 metres.
- Stott Lane, west side, from a point 385 metres south of the southerly kerb-line of Eccles Old Road, in a southerly direction to a point 47 metres north of the northerly kerb-line of Eccles New Road, a distance of 146 metres.

Stott Lane, east side, from a point 55 metres south of the southerly kerb-line of Eccles Old Road, in a southerly direction to a point 15 metres north of the northerly kerb-line of Meadowgate Road.

Stott Lane, east side, from a point 15 metres south of the sourtherly kerb-line of Meadowgate Road, in a southerly direction to a point 47 metres north of the northerly kerb-line of Eccles New Road, a distance of 358 metres. (600)

(Manchester Road and Banbury Mews, Wardley, Swinton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994

(Beech Street, Swinton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994
