TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Town and Country Planning General Regulations 1992

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order entitled "The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (County of Derbyshire) (No. 1) Order 1994". The Order comes into operation on 7th September 1994 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on a length of highway on the west side of Norfolk Square, Glossop, Derbyshire, commencing at its junction with Henry Street to its junction with High Street West, a distance of 53.6 metres in a southerly direction.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, by applying to the Government Office for the East Midlands, Planning and Transport Directorate, Cranbrook House, Cranbrook Street, Nottingham NG1 1EY (quoting Ref. No. EMCM 5050/41/39/2) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the High Peak Borough Council, Municipal Buildings, Glossop, Derbyshire.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act, or that any requirement of that Act, or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 much 6 much 20 much and 1000 much achieve the back within 6 weeks from 7th September 1994, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 7th September 1994 has had an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the High Peak Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or

her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 12 months from 7th September 1994, unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of areas of Castle Square, City Centre, Sheffield.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted by Sheffield Metropolitan District Council on 12th August 1994, under Refs. 94/0619P and 94/0622P.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during 28 days commencing on 7th September 1994 at the offices of the Administration and Legal Department, Sheffield Metropolitan District Council, Town Hall, Sheffield and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Government Office for Yorkshire and Humberside (quoting Ref. YHDOT U4420/35/1/4) at the address stated below.

Any person may object to the making of the proposed Order within the period of 28 days commencing on 7th September 1994 by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, quoting the above reference, at the Directorate of Housing, Planning and Transport, Government Office for Yorkshire and Humberside, 9th Floor, City House, New Station Street, Leeds LS1 4JD.

In preparing an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of it may be imparted to other persons who may be affected by it and that those persons may wish to communicate with the objector about it.
