#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Borough of Chorley, Parish of Adlington, Public Paths 14 and 16

Temporary Diversion Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 247, 253 and 261 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, if planning permission is granted for mineral extraction and waste disposal at Rigby Quarry, Aldlington, Chorley, proposes to make an Order the effects of which will be to suspend for a period not exceeding ten years that part of public footpath 14 Adlington in Chorley, from the eastern side of Rigby House Farm generally south-west to the south-western corner of Houghton Quarry, and that part of footpath 16 Adlington in Chorley, from its junction with footpath 15 Adlington in Chorley generally north-west to a point 50 metres east of its junction with footpath 17 Adlington in Chorley; and to provide temporary foothpaths, for the same period, from footpath 14 Adlington in Chorley along the northern perimeter of Rigby House, then generally south-west along the south side of the boundry of Houghton House Quarry to its south-western corner, and along the line of footpath 15 Aldington in Chorley from its junction with footpath 16 Adlington in Chorley then generally west along the line of footpath 17 Adlington in Chorley then north-west to join footpath 16 Adlington in Chorley 90 metres east of its junction with footpath 17 Adlington in Chorley.

The lines and situations of the existing and proposed temporary alternative highways are shown on the map annexed to the Order.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited at the offices of the Chorley Borough Council, Town Hall, Market Street, Chorley and may be inspected free of charge during normal working hours. Any representation or objection to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment (Ref: PNW/5063/151/8), Government Office for the North-West, Room 1211, Sunley Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE, not later than 28 days from the date of this notice and should clearly state the grounds on which it is made.

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Town and Country Planning General Regulations 1976 Pedestrianisation of a Highway at Workington, Cumbria

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Allerdale Borough Council, he has made an Order under section 249 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, entitled "The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (County of Cumbria) (No. 3) Order 1994". The Order comes into operation on 23rd September 1994 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to this Order) on an area of the unnamed highway adjacent to the Central Station Car Park, Workington. The area commences 8 metres south of the pedestrian underpass.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 23rd September 1994, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 23rd September 1994, has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Allerdale Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 23rd September 1994, unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

The A43 Trunk Road (Stamford Road, Easton-on-the-Hill, Northamptonshire) (Extension of 50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 199.

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on that length of the A43 Trunk Road known as Stamford Road at Easton-on-the-Hill, in the district of East Northamptonshire, in the county of Northamptonshire from a point 40 metres north-east of its junction with Racecourse Road to a point 40 metres north-east of its junction with Slaters Drift, a distance of approximately 1,827 metres, part of which is at present derestricted.
