THE RESTRICTIVE PRACTICES COURT (IN ENGLAND AND WALES) 1994 No. 5 (E & W)

In the Matter of the Restrictive Trade Practices Act 1976 and in the Matter of an Agreement among the Members of the National Federation of Retail Newsagents.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Rule 55(3)(a) of the Restrictive Practices Court Rules 1976, that on 24th August 1994 there was issued out of the Restrictive Practices Court (in England and Wales) by the Director General of Fair Trading, pursuant to section 35(3) of the said Act, a Notice of Application for an Order restraining the Respondents from giving effect to or enforcing the said Agreement.

And notice is hereby further given that, pursuant to Rule 55(2)(c) of the said Rules, the said Director General has nominated the National Federation of Retail Newsagents, of Yeoman House, Sekforde Street, London EC1R 0HD as Representative Respondent to represent (for the purposes of all proceedings in the above matter) all parties to the said Agreement.

Any party to the said Agreement in respect of the said proceedings who objects to being represented by the said National Federation of Retail Newsagents may, pursuant to Rule 55(3)(b) of the said Rules, apply by notice in writing within 28 days of the publication of this notice to the Restrictive Practices Court, Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London WC2A 2LL, for an Order revoking or modifying the nomination and for such other directions as may be specified in any such application.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The A470 Trunk Road (Conway Road, Glan Conwy, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1, 2, 4 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time (with certain exceptions) on the side of the A470 Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road") described in Schedule 1 to this notice. It will also revoke and re-enact, amended as necessary, the provisions of the Trunk Road (Conway Road, Glan Conwy) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1974 which currently impose a waiting prohibition on the sides of road described in Schedule 2.

Copies of the proposed Order, Order being revoked, relevant plan and statement of reasons for the making of the proposed Order may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at Aberconwy Borough Council, Bodlondeb, Conwy, Gwynedd, during a period of 21 days from 29th September 1994.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, and quoting reference ZC 510-2-4-84 must be sent in writing to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, by 20th October 1994. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE 1

The eastern side of that length of the trunk road known as Conway Road or Llanrwst Road at Glan Conwy in the county of Gwynedd which extends from a point 41 metres north of the centrepoint of its junction with Church Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 12 metres.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The western side of that length of the trunk road known as Conway Road or Llanrwst Road which extends from a point 41 metres south of the centrepoint of its junction with Church Street in a northerly direction to a point 110 metres north of the centrepoint of that junction.
