#### **TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990**

The Diversion of Highways (East Street, Tylorstown, Rhondda, Mid Glamorgan) Order 1994

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the diversion of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development, consisting of a sports centre for Rhondda Fach, to be carried out.

The diversion is authorised to enable the said development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to and by Rhondda Borough Council on 29th December 1993 under ref. 54/93/0765.

The Order requires Rhondda Borough Council to provide a new highway which shall be the diversion, and which shall be maintainable at the public expense and for which the highway authority shall be Mid Glamorgan County Council; and that the diversion must not be carried out until this new highway has been provided.

Copies of the Order may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Rhondda Borough Council, Borough Architects Department, Bronwydd, Porth, Mid Glamorgan during a period of 6 weeks from 5th October 1994.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act, he may within 6 weeks of 5th October 1994, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

### SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The length of highway to be diverted is at Tylorstown, Rhondda in the county of Mid Glamorgan. It is shown by zebra hatching on the annexed plan and is that length of highway known as East Street, which extends from a point 7.5 metres east of its junction with East Road (B4277) in a general easterly direction for a distance of 55 metres on its north-western side and 78 metres on its south-eastern side. ### WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

Cumbria County Council (Wartbarrow and Kirkhead) Limestone Pavement Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that on 29th September 1994 the Secretary of State for the Environment, acting under the provisions of section 34(2) of and paragraphs 3(1) and 6(2) of Schedule 11 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, having considered the unopposed Cumbria County Council (Wartbarrow and Kirkhead) Limestone Pavement Order 1994 which took effect when it was made on 4th February 1994, decided to take no action on the Order. This means that the Order continues in force.

The Order designates the lands described in the Schedule to the Order in accordance with section 34(2) of the Act and prohibits the removal or disturbance of limestone on or in that land.

Copies of the Order and map referred to in it and of this notice have been deposited at the offices of the Cumbria County Council, The Courts, Carlisle, Cumbria CA3 8LZ, and may be seen free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person who is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 34 of the said Act of 1981, or that any of the requirements of Schedule 11 to that Act have not been complied with in relation to it,
