The Chester-Bangor Trunk Road (A55) (Aber Improvement)
Detrunking Order 199

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980(a) the effect of which is that the length of the Chester-Bangor (A55) Trunk Road which has been superseded by the Chester-Bangor (A55) Trunk Road (Aber Improvement) shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date this Order comes into force.

authorise the stopping-up of two parts of the eastern footway of Northumberland Grove, N.17.
