Notice of application for consent for the purposes of section 88

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Schedule 10 of the above Act that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority by Midland Meat Packers Limited for consent to discharge up to 1,500 cubic metres per day of trade effluent consisting of process and washdown water generated by the abattoir and processing treatment plant to the Clifton Brook at National Grid Reference SP 5847 7346 from Midland Meat Packers Limited, Crick, Northamptonshire.

This is an application to replace an existing consent that currently authorises the discharge of up to 1,000 cubic metres per day of treated sewage effluent from the abattoir and meat processing plant. Should this application be granted the existing consent will be revoked.

Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

Take notice that Ralph Harrison and Partners, of Hall Farm, Wighton, Wells-next-the-Sea, Norfolk NR23 1AL, is applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to abstract water from a borehole at National Grid Reference TF 925 398 at Field Barn Farm in the parish of Wighton.

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 15 cubic metres per hour, 345 cubic metres per day, 68.1 thousand cubic metres between April and September each year.

The water will be used for spray irrigation. This proposal will result in an existing licence No. 7/34/3/SG/27, which is for direct abstraction from the River Stiffkey being reduced from 1,137 cubic metres per day to 792 cubic metres per day. The annual aggregate of the two licences to be no more than the existing licence No. 7/34/3/SG/27 of 68.1 thousand cubic metres.

ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Arun District Council (Off-street Parking Places) Order 1995

The Arun District Council (Off-street Parking Places) (Miscellaneous Order) 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Arun District Council, in exercise of their powers under sections 32, 35(1), (4) and (6) to (9) of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 (The Act) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers with the consent of the County Council of West Sussex in accordance with section 39(3) of the Act and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police propose to make two Orders, the effect of which is to replace and amend the

Arun District Council (Off-street Parking Places) Order 1994, and the Arun District Council (Off-street Parking Places) (Miscellaneous) Order 1994. It is proposed that:

- (1) The Orders will come into operation on 1st April 1995.
- (2) The original Orders will be revoked and consolidated and replaced by the new Orders subject to proposed minor amendments.
- (3) The scale of charges shall be amended only in relation to the Excess Charge which shall be discounted to £20 if paid within 7 days (except the Rustington Car Park which shall remain at the discounted sum of £5).
- (4) The Town Hall Bognor Regis Car Park shall be included within the existing Order to operate at weekends only.

Extension of a Metered Parking Place in Gresham Street

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of London, on 28th October 1994, made:

- (a) the City of London (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 3) Order 1994, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985; and
- (b) the City of London (Parking Places) (No. 8) Order 1994, under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

Notice of the Common Council's intention to make the Orders was first given in *The London Gazette*, on 20th September 1994, issue No. 53795, page No. 13217, Ref. 488, and the effect of the Orders will be the same as given in that notice.

The general effect of the Orders will be to extend an existing metered parking place by converting part of an adjacent disabled persons parking place in Gresham Street.

A copy of each of the Orders, which will come into operation on 7th November 1994, of the City of London (Parking Places) (No. 4) Order 1994, of the City of London (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 1994, and of a plan showing the affected street, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made in The Town Clerk's Department, The Guildhall, London EC2P 2EJ.

Copies of the Orders may be obtained from the City Engineer's Department, Guildhall, London E.C.2.

Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to either of the Orders may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
