Subject: Meat products (as defined in Directive 77/99/EEC) derived from swine.

Country of Origin: Portugal.

Conditions attaching to Licence:

A. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with the terms of the Council Directive on health problems affecting intra-Community trade in meat products 77/99/EEC signed by an official veterinarian of the Government of Portugal.

B. In accordance with Article 3(3) of Commission Decision 93/602/EC the certificate shall bear the following additional wording:

"Products conforming to Commission Decision 93/602/EC of 19th November 1993, concerning certain protection measures relating to African swine fever in Portugal as amended by 94/122/EC.

C. Meat products derived from pig meat from the areas listed at Note 1 must be treated in accordance with Article 4(i)(a) of Council Directive 80/215/EEC of 22nd January 1980 on health problems affecting intra-Community trade in meat products:

EITHER

(i) in a hermetically sealed container with an Fo value of 3.00 or more;

OR

(ii) under the following conditions—in so far as the products concerned are prepared exclusively from or with pig meat from farms from areas not subject to banning orders on health policy grounds, following the establishment of the existence of African Swine Fever:

- the meat was fully boned and the main lymphatic glands removed;
- before heating each piece of meat as referred to above was enclosed in a hermetically sealed container to be marketed therein;
- the meat in its container underwent heat treatment in strict conformity with the following conditions;
- the product was kept at a temperature of at least 60°C for a minimum of four hours during which the centre temperature must be at least 70°C for a minimum of 30 minutes.
- the temperature of a representative number of samples of each batch of products was monitored constantly. Monitoring was carried out using automatic apparatus enabling the temperature to be recorded both in the centre of the pieces of meat product and inside the heating equipment.

D. All consignments of products to which this licence refers are subject to the terms of the Products of Animal Origin (Import and Export) Regulations 1992, and any product imported under this licence shall be made available, if so required, for inspection by an officer of the Ministry at a place nominated by him/her for such inspection, and in particular the provisions of Regulation 7(3) of the above Regulations shall apply. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him/her to carry out the inspection in such manner as he/she shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.

Subject: Fresh/refrigerated/frozen poultry meat carcasses/part carcasses and/or offal derived from domestic hens, ducks, geese, guinea fowl and turkeys.

Country of Origin: All EC Member States.

Conditions Attaching to Licence:

1. Each consignment:

EITHER

(a) must be accompanied by a commercial document issued in accordance with the terms of Article 3 1A(i) of Council Directive 71/118/EEC as amended and updated by Council Directive 92/116/EEC,

OR

(b) in the case of consignments intended for a Member State after transit through a third country, must be accompanied by a health certificate in accordance with Council Directive 91/494/EEC amended by Council Directive 92/116/EEC, signed by an official veterinarian of the country of origin stating:

- (i) Details of the consignment i.e. species, nature of cuts, nature of packaging, number of cuts or packages, month(s) and year(s) when frozen, net weight;
- (ii) Address(es) and veterinary approval number(s) of the slaughterhouse(s), cutting plant(s) and cold store(s);
- (iii) Destination of meat (place of loading, country and place of destination, means of transport—for railway wagons or goods vehicles the registration number should be given, for aircraft the flight number and for boats the name) names and addresses of consignor and consignee.

(iv) Health Attestation

I, the undersigned official veterinarian, certify that the poultry meat described above satisfies the requirements of the Council Directive 91/494/EEC of 26th June 1991 on animal health conditions governing intra-Community trade in and imports from third countries of fresh poultry meat and also the requirements of the second subparagraph of Article 3(A) (1) of that Directive, if such meat is destined for a Member State or region of a Member State that is recognised as being free of Newcastle Disease.

All consignments of products to which this licence refers are subject to the terms of the Products of Animal Origin (Import and Export) Regulations 1992, and any product imported under this licence shall be made available, if so required, for inspection by an officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him/her for such inspection, and in particular the provisions of Regulation 7(3) of the above Regulations shall apply.
