The West Lancashire District Council (Lindens, Ashurst, Skelmersdale) (Street Parking Place for Disabled Persons) Order 1994.

WEST LANCASHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

1. The District Council of West Lancashire (New Court Way, Ormskirk) (Variation of Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994

2. The District Council of West Lancashire (Windrows, Skelmersdale) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that the West Lancashire District Council have made the above Orders in accordance with the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into effect on 7th November 1994.

The effect of the Orders is to prohibit waiting at any time on lengths of:

1. New Court Way, Ormskirk.
2. Windrows, Skelmersdale.

The restrictions at New Court Way, Ormskirk, are in place of restrictions currently in force on that road, which are revoked by the Order.

Exemptions are provided in the Order to permit waiting on the affected lengths of road by vehicles carrying disabled persons and for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers,
- (b) loading or unloading goods,
