BARNSELY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Wombwell) (Traffic Regulation Consolidation) Order 1987 (Amendment No. 12) Order 1994.

Notice is hereby given that on 28th October 1994, the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council made an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 14th November 1994, will be to prohibit vehicles waiting at any time on part of the south-eastern side of Marsh Street, Wombwell, which extends from Smith Street for 15 metres; and on part of the south-west side of Smith Street, which extends from Marsh Street for 5 metres.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and services therein, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets. The usual exceptions for disabled persons' vehicles are also included in the Order.

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Wombwell) (Traffic Regulation Consolidation) Order 1987 (Amendment No. 11) Order 1994.
