The East Sussex (Various Roads in Brighton) (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) Order 1994 No. 14

Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council have made an Order on 2nd November 1994, coming into operation on 7th November 1994, under sections 32(1), 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which introduces disabled persons' parking places along the following lengths of road:

Disabled Persons' Parking Places

Park Crescent Road, north-west side: outside of No. 6.
Singleton Road, south side: outside of No. 8.
Tivoli Crescent, east side: outside of No. 18.
Wolseley Road, south side: opposite the boundary of Nos. 60-62.

Additionally, the disabled bays in Sandgate Road outside of No. 1 and Hollingdean Terrace outside of No. 64 are no longer required and are therefore being revoked.

The East Sussex (Stanford Avenue, Brighton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of, and Part III of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which will introduce no waiting at any time restrictions along the following lengths of Stanford Road opposite the pedestrian refuges:

The East Sussex (Hanover Area, Brighton (Improvement Scheme Stage 3)) (20 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which will create a 20 m.p.h. speed limit for an 18-month period, along the following roads:

20 m.p.h. limit

Albion Hill, between Albion Street and Queen's Park Road.
Newhaven Street, for its entire length.
Lewes Street, for its entire length.
Belgrave Street, for its entire length.
Newark Street, for its entire length.
Jersey Street, for its entire length.
Grove Street, for its entire length.
Holland Street, for its entire length.
Scotland Street, for its entire length.
Quebec Street, for its entire length.
Montreal Road, for its entire length.
Toronto Terrace, between Albion Hill and Southover Street.

This speed limit Order is proposed in connection with the installation of road humps and associated package of traffic measures in the area, and means that no person shall be able to drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 m.p.h.

An exemption is however included in the Order for any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

If the speed limit proves to be effective an application will be made to the Secretary of state for Transport, for consent to make the Order permanent at the end of the 18-month period.

Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which will prohibit motor vehicles from driving on the following lengths of road:
