The North Yorkshire County Council (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles in Excess of 7.5 Tonnes Gross Vehicle Weight) (Honeymoon Cottage Bridge, near Moulton) Order 1994.

Notice is hereby given that on 24th October 1994 North Yorkshire County Council made an Order under sections 1(1), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicles in excess of 7.5 tonnes gross vehicle weight from proceeding along any road or length of road specified in the following table except for vehicles being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes of a gross vehicle weight not exceeding 10.2 tonnes.
