

Description of the Halton Area Prohibition Zone Boundary

1. from a point on Kellet Lane at the south-west side of its junction with Back Lane, Nether Kellet proceeding in a southerly direction to Long Dales Lane at its junction with Dunald Mill Lane, then
2. in a south-easterly direction on the south side of Dunald Mill Lane to its junction with Kirkby Lonsdale Road, then
3. in a southerly direction on the east side of Park Lane, Halton to its junction with Low Road, Halton, then
4. in a southerly direction on the east side of Low Road to its junction with A683 at Caton, then
5. westwards along the north side of A683 to its junction with M6, then
6. along the south side of the River Lune, crossing to the north side 400 metres south-west of Lune Aqueduct and proceeding to the junction of Halton Road with Green Lane/Whalley Lane at Beaumont, then
7. in a north-westerly direction along the north side of Green Lane to A6 Slyne Road, then
8. in a northerly direction on the east side of A6 Slyne Road to its junction with Bottomdale Road, Slyne, continuing along the east side of A6 to its junction (A6 Bypass Road) with Slyne Road, Bolton-le-Sands, then north-easterly on the east side of Slyne Road to its junction with The Nook/Bolton Lane, then
9. eastwards along the south side of Bolton Lane, crossing Bolton Lane to its north side just east of the junction with Mount Pleasant Lane, then along the north side of Bolton Lane to its junction with Kellet Lane, then
10. along the north side of Kellet Lane to the south-west side of its junction with Back Lane, Nether Kellet.

*Changes to Controlled Parking Zones in the London Borough of Enfield**Enfield Town Controlled Parking Zone—Extension of Zone Area and Introduction of Residents' Visitors Parking Cards**Enfield Town, Oakwood, Bush Hill Park, Grange Park—Introduction of Special Permits, Carers Permits and Transferable Business Permits.*

The proposed schemes include changes which would:

- (a) create an Inner Controlled Parking Zone and an Outer Controlled Parking Zone in the Enfield Town Area;
- (b) make available residents' parking permits for each Zone. The Inner Zone permits would be marked with the letter "A" and the Outer Zone permits would be marked with the letter "B". The permits would not be transferable between Zones;
- (c) continue to make available community health staff parking permits and social services staff parking permits for both Zones;

- (d) revise the layout of some of the residents' parking places and business parking places in the Enfield Town Parking Zones. Additional streets and lengths of streets have been included in the Outer Parking Zone;
- (e) introduce Special Permits in all of the Enfield Parking Zones which would be made available to those who are able to demonstrate a provision of health or welfare services through their employment;
- (f) introduce Carers Permits in all of the Enfield Parking Zones which would be made available to those who are able to demonstrate a provision of health or welfare care to an elderly or infirm friend or relative;
- (g) introduce Residents' Visitor Parking Cards which would be made available to households in the Enfield Town area which would allow visitors to park their vehicles in a residents' parking place, provided they display a valid parking card;
- (h) introduce business parking permits in all of the Enfield Parking Zones which may be transferred between vehicles (though not between Zones).

Other minor and consequential changes are also included in the proposed schemes.

under sections 6, 45, 46, 49, 51 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the Residents' Parking Places (Enfield Town Zone A) Order would be to:

- (a) revoke the designation of the parking places in the Enfield Town area designated by the Enfield (Residents' Parking Places) (Enfield Town) (Special Parking Area) (No. 1) Order 1994;
- (b) designate residents' parking places in Burleigh Way, Chalkwell Park Avenue, Chapel Street, Chase Side, Enfield, Churchbury Lane, Essex Road, Fir Tree Walk, Fyfield Road, Genotin Road, Gentleman's Row, Lincoln Road, Little Park Gardens, Raleigh Road, River Front, Roseneath Walk, St. Andrew's Road, Sydney Road, Tiptree Drive, Wilford Close, Willow Road, the service road fronting Nos. 43 to 63 Baker Street and the service road fronting Nos. 70 to 106 London Road at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;
- (c) provide that the parking places would operate between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (d) provide that residents' permits, bearing the letter "A", and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by any person residing in the streets or lengths of streets listed in Schedule 1 to this notice (i.e. Enfield Town Controlled Parking Zone—Zone A) who is the owner of a passenger vehicle (12 seats or less), a goods carrying vehicle not more than 2.28 metres in height, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage);
