

(e) provide that community health staff permits and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by the Enfield Community Care NHS Trust (maximum nineteen permits), the Chase Farm Hospital NHS Trust (maximum nineteen permits) or the New River Health Authority (maximum two permits) on behalf of an employee, provided that the employee is required to visit a person residing in a street or length of street referred to in sub-paragraph (d) and who is the owner of a vehicle of a class referred to in that sub-paragraph;

(NOTE: the community health staff permits are valid for all Controlled Parking Zones within the London Borough of Enfield);

(f) provide that social services staff permits and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by the Directorate of Social Services of the London Borough of Enfield (maximum forty permits) on behalf of an employee, provided that the employee is required to visit a person residing in a street or length of street referred to in sub-paragraph (d) and who is the owner of a vehicle of a class referred to in that sub-paragraph;

(NOTE: the social services staff permits are valid for all Controlled Parking Zones within the London Borough of Enfield);

(g) provide that special permits and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by a provider of private health care, provided that the applicant is required to visit a person residing in a street or length of street referred to in sub-paragraph (d) and who is the owner of a vehicle of a class referred to in that sub-paragraph;

(NOTE: the special permits are valid for all Controlled Parking Zones within the London Borough of Enfield);

(h) provide that carers permits, bearing the letter "A", and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by a person who provides care to an elderly or infirm person residing in a street or length of street referred to in sub-paragraph (d) on a regular and frequent basis and who is the owner of a vehicle of a class referred to in that sub-paragraph;

(i) provide that residents' visitor parking cards, bearing the letter "A", would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by any person residing in the streets or lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (d) above which may be used by any vehicle of a class referred to in that sub-paragraph;

Provided that a maximum of fifty parking cards per year would be available to a household;

(j) provide that the charge for the issue of a residents' permit, a special permit or a carers permit, which would be valid for a period of twelve months running from the beginning of the month in which it first becomes valid, shall be £20;

(k) provides that the charge for the issue of a community health staff permit or a social services staff permit, which would be valid for a period of twelve months running from the beginning of the month in which it first becomes valid, shall be £5;

(l) provide that the charge for the issue of residents' visitor parking cards which, upon validation, would be valid for either the morning period (8 p.m. to 2 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive) or the afternoon period (12 noon to 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive), would be 50 pence each. These vouchers would be available in booklets comprising ten vouchers each. Up to a maximum of two validated vouchers may be displayed at any one time, which would allow parking all day in the parking space;

(m) provide that certain vehicles may wait, free of charge, in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum two minutes), to load or unload (maximum twenty minutes), and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

3. The general effect of the Residents' Parking Places (Enfield Town Zone B) Order would be to:

(a) designate residents' parking places in Apple Grove, Beresford Gardens, Burleigh Road, Camberly Avenue, Chase Court Gardens, Chase Green, Chase Green Avenue, Chase Hill, Churchbury Close, Churchbury Lane, Eaton Road, Elizabeth Avenue, Firbank Close, Florence Avenue, Florence Drive, Gladbeck Way, Gresham Close, Ladysmith Road, Lincoln Road, Lyndhurst Gardens, Monastery Gardens, Old Park Avenue, Park Crescent, Parsonage Lane, Peartree Road, Queens Road, Enfield, Seaford Road, Shirley Road, Stanley Road, Uvedale Road, Village Road, Walsingham Road,

Wellington Road and Whitethorn Gardens at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;

(b) contain similar provisions to those set out in paragraphs 2(c), 2(j), 2(k), 2(l) and 2(m) above;

(c) contain similar provisions to those set out in paragraphs 2(d), 2(e), 2(f), 2(g), 2(h) and 2(i) above, in relation to persons residing in the streets and lengths of streets listed in Schedule 2 to this Notice (i.e. the Enfield Town Controlled Parking Zone—Zone B), and with the residents' permits, the carers permits and the residents' visitor parking cards bearing the letter "B".

4. The general effect of the Business Parking Places (Enfield Town Zone A) Order would be to:

(a) revoke the designation of the parking places in the Enfield Town area designated by the Enfield (Business Parking Places) (Enfield Town) (Special Parking Area) (No. 1) Order 1994;

(b) designate business parking places in Essex Road, Fyfield Road, Lincoln Road, Little Park Gardens, River Front and Sydney Road at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;

(c) provide that business permits, bearing the letter "A", and protective covers would be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by any person (hereinafter referred to as a "business user") who occupies premises in the streets or parts of streets listed in Schedule 1 to this notice (i.e. Enfield Town Controlled Parking Zone—Zone A) and who uses such premises for non-residential purposes and which may be used in respect of a passenger vehicle (12 seats or less), a goods carrying vehicle not more than 2.28 metres in height, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage;

(NOTE: Each business user would be restricted to not more than eight business permits, though these may be transferred between vehicles of a class referred to above);

(d) provide that the charge for the issue of a business permit:

(i) which would be valid for a period of three months running from the beginning of the month in which it first becomes valid, shall be £90;

(ii) which would be valid for a period of twelve months running from the beginning of the month in which it first becomes valid, shall be £348;

(e) contain similar provisions to those set out in paragraphs 2(c) and 2(m) above.

5. The general effect of the Business Parking Places (Enfield Town Zone B) Order would be to:

(a) designate business parking places in Chase Court Gardens, Chase Green, Eaton Road, Florence Avenue, Ladysmith Road, Old Park Avenue, Queens Road, Enfield and Shirley Road at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;

(b) contain similar provisions to those set out in paragraphs 2(c), 2(m) and 4(d) above;

(c) contain similar provisions to those set out in paragraph 4(c) above, in relation business users occupying premises listed in Schedule 2 to this notice (i.e. the Enfield Town Controlled Parking Zone—Zone B), and with the business permits bearing the letter "B".

6. The general effect of the Disabled Persons Parking Places Order would be to:

(a) revoke the designation by the Enfield (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (Special Parking Area) (No. 1) Order 1994 of the disabled persons parking place numbered 89 therein situated in St. Andrew's Road;

(b) designate disabled persons parking places in Chase Green Avenue, Lyndhurst Gardens and St. Andrew's Road (2) in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;

(c) provide that the disabled persons parking places may operate at any time;

(d) specify, in respect of the disabled persons parking places, that disabled persons vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge (commonly known as "the Orange Badge") issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975 or 1982 may be left therein; and

(e) provide that certain other vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum two minutes), to load or unload (maximum twenty minutes), etc.
